## Guided and Narrated Tour

### The Tour Includes:

- Your own F13 mini speed boat
- USCG approved life jacket
- Instruction covering boating basics, rules of the road, tour hand signals, and professionally trained guide leading and narrating the tour

## FAQ's:

### Are there any restriction or weight requirements?

*Age/Children: We recommend children riding with adults to be ages 5 & up. Children under 5 are welcome on a case to case basis, as long as the conditions of the water are fair, and the child can "hold on" physically. If the conditions are rough, it is not safe for a child under 5.*

*Age/Driver: To drive the boat alone, a person must be 18yrs old. 16 & up may drive as long as an adult is in the boat as well.*

*Height/Weight: No height requirement; Each boat may not exceed 450lbs.*

### Any health restrictions?

*Part of the fun at Speed Boat Adventures Tours is that, at times, we will be riding in open water. Although usually calm, the harbor can be choppy at time . **We do not recommend guest with neck or back problems or a recent surgery to participate. Pregnant woman should not participate.***

### What to bring/ wear?

1. Wear what you would to the beach depending on the temperature (swimsuit in the summer and a jacket in the winter)
2. Sun block
3. A towel for afterwards
4. Sun block
5. Sunglasses

### What if I get sea sick?

*Normally seasickness is caused by the slow rolling motion in the ocean. Since the Sea Rocket is moving along at high speeds it normally doesn't bother people that are prone to getting seasick.*
